For 65 years, St. Vincent and Sarah Fisher Center has helped support children and families in crisis.

The center's six programs in-clude residential treatment, spe-

cial needs adoption, treatment foster care, Marillac pregnancy services, Seton Community Pre-school and Infant Child Care, and Transitions residential program for mothers and infants.

Overall these programs provide comprehensive services to 250 infants, youth and families on a daily basis.

This year, the center celebrates the 150th anniversary of its foun-ders, the Daughters of Charity, who came to Detroit in 1845 to open one of the city's first hospi-tals, now Providence Hospital.

Within two years, the sisters re-sponded to community need es-tablishing the St. Vincent Orphan

program for unwed and/or der ed mothers and their children.

The doors of the St. Vincent and Sarah Fisher Center were officially opened in Farmington Hills in 1929 to house existing programs and provide additional quality care and treatment to the community's children and families in need.

Tickets to the Garden Party are \$90 per person, \$300 for patrons, which includes two tickets, and \$500 for benefactors, which in-cludes four tickets.


