about the art — to stimulate their imagination. That's bound to make them more thoughtful and creative in everything they do."
Rodmond is highly experienced in introducing children to art. She has a bachelor of fine arts degree, along with a master of arts degree in special education. An art teacher for five years at a Livonia junior high school and in Birmingham parachial schools grades K-8, she stopped teaching to have a family and later began helping her husband part time in his sporting goods atore in Dearborn.


