Farmington Hills police are inviting residents — and former Red Wing Alex Delucchio — to the seventh annual open house from noon to 4 p.m. Sunday, June 12.

Delucchio will be signing autographs at the police department headquarters, 13655 Eleven Mile at Orchard Lake Road.

A full slate of activities is planned, including a visit from the Ferndale Police Robot, Oakland County Sheriff's Department Marine Division and the West Bloomfield Mounted Division.

"We also have a hydroplane display and Detroit Police and Survival flight helicopters," said Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer.

There's live entertainment, a weapons display, a traffic safety program, free child fingerprinting and bicycle registration.

Police are preparing tours of their department and displays of emergency vehicles from a number of local departments.

"Attendees will have the opportunity for hands-on training with the police firearms training simulator," said Sgt. John Hedrick of the Crime Prevention section. "Kids can win prizes while testing their skill at one of several new games."

Also featured are the Michigan State Police SWAT Vehicle and the Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms Bomb Truck along and the U.S. Secret Service.

FM radio station WLLZ, in Farmington Hills, will also be on hand.
