The Michigan Department of Transportation and the Road Commission for Oakland County think they have found a way to improve the flow of traffic in the Northwestern Highway/Orchard Lake Road area, according to an MDOT press release.

Working with Novi, Farmington Hills, West Bloomfield Town-

ship and Commerce Township governments, MDOT and the county road commission have developed ideas for possible improvements to Orchard Lake Road, 14 Mile Road, or Maple Road in the area between Northwestern Highway and Haggerty Road. The project team is looking for comments, sugges-
