In smaller roles, Mark Nathanson and Ara Basharian are delightfully silly as mobsters, as are David Rau as guru Dr. Mandril and Roz Basharian as a flamboyant masseuse.

Set designer Michael Gordon and art director Ann Dehman accomplish wonders given the limitations of the outdoor setting. Costumes by Theresa Reseigh and Linda Watson work very well, as does Obie Burch's lighting.

Sound designer Susan Jolliffe has made a huge improvement in what has always been a major problem at the Greek theater. Unfortunately, the very capable orchestra still overpowered the singers a few times, particularly at the very start and end of the show.

Overall, "City of Angels" is a real triumph for St. Dunstan's, both artistically and technically.

Barbara Michaels is an inveterate play-goer who regularly catches up on all the New York productions.

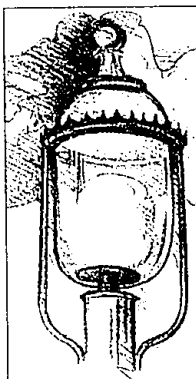
