

Oakland Schools chief quits after long tenure

A mid-year change of turmoil in public education and uncertainty about things to come, longtime Oakland Schools Superintendent William G. Keane has announced his resignation.

Since 1980 Keane, 61, has directed the actions of the Oakland County Intermediate School District, which provides services to Oakland County's 28 school districts that they might not be able to afford on their own.

With major changes coming in the way intermediate school districts operate and relate to the rest of the public education apparatus, Keane said he thought it best to step aside and let someone else help form the new system.

Among the changes Keane predicts is a smaller state subsidy. "We're going to have fewer resources certainly from the state," he said.

At its next meeting on Tuesday, June 14, the Intermediate School District's five-member board will likely discuss Keane's departure and what to do about a replacement.

Last year a similar job opening occurred in Wayne County's Regional Education Service Agency when director William Simmons retired. The RESA board eventually hired Mike Flanagan, who had been superintendent of Farmington Schools.

John Schultz, superintendent of Rochester Schools, said intermediate school district superintendents ought to have backgrounds that include being superintendent of a local school district.

"We need to have the understanding that the person in the job has been in your job," Schultz said.

Keane's departure in August will leave "a big void," Schultz said. "He provided the leadership we needed to be effective."

Schultz remembers Keane's tutelage when he first became Rochester Schools' superintendent 11 years ago. "He was very professional, candid and helpful."

Keane's new job will be teaching full-time at Oakland University, where he already teaches part-time. Keane will teach leadership and school personnel management and coordinate the specialist program during the master's degree in the Department of Education Leadership.

The Huntington Woods resident began his education career as an English teacher in junior high, high school and community college. Before coming to Oakland Schools, he was superintendent in Berkley Public Schools for nine years.

Keane has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Oakland County, the Oakland County Library, Community Services for the Hearing Impaired and the Oakland County Chamber of Commerce.

He has also received awards, served on five state committees and written numerous articles in education publications.

His college teaching experience goes back to 1972 and includes stints at Wayne State University and Eastern Michigan University.

NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT COMBINED WITH NOTICE TO PUBLIC OF REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS.

TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS:

On or about June 27, 1994 the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland County will request the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383) for the following project:

1) Linden Storm Drain which includes the installation of approximately 1200 linear feet of 18" to 24" storm drain pipe, as well as catch basins and ditching in the Linden right-of-way. Census Tract 1675, Block 5, Est. Cost: \$100,000.

2) Middlebelt/Eldon Storm Drain which includes the installation of approximately 1000 linear feet of 18" to 24" storm drain pipe which catch basins in the Middlebelt & Eldon right-of-ways. Census Tract 1675, Block 1 & 2, Est. Cost: \$40,000.

3) Kemberton Park Street Lighting which includes the installation of 10 street lights along Grayfield & Astor, Census Tract 1675, Block 3, Est. Cost: \$25,000.

It has been determined that such request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly, the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (PL 91-190).

The reasons for such decision not to prepare such Statement are as follows:

The proposed project will require only minor alterations to the landscape and will not destroy or interrupt natural features of the surrounding environment, such as but not limited to water courses or wildlife.

An Environmental Review Record respecting the within project has been made by the above-named Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such Statement is not required. This Environmental Review Record is on file at the above address and is available for public examination and copying, upon request at the Community Development office between the hours of 8:30 A.M. and 4:30 P.M.

No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted prior to the request for release of Federal funds.

All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. to the City Manager at 31555 W. 11 Mile, Farmington Hills, MI 48336. Such written comments should be received at 31555 W. Eleven Mile Rd., Farmington Hills, MI 48336 on or before June 24, 1994. All such comments so received will be considered and the City of Farmington Hills, Oakland Co. will not request the release of Federal funds or take any administrative action on the within project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Farmington Hills will undertake the project described above with Block Grant funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. Farmington Hills is certifying to HUD that Farmington Hills and William M. Costick is its official capacity as City Manager, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making, and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its satisfaction its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. HUD will accept an objection to its approval of the release of funds and acceptance of the certification only if it is one of the following bases: (a) That the certification was not in fact executed by the chief executive officer or other officer of applicant approved by HUD; or (b) that applicant's environmental review record for the project indicates omission of a required decision, finding, or step applicable to the project in the environment review process. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedure (34 CFR Part 45), and may be addressed to HUD at Department of Housing and Urban Development, Federal Building, 477 Michigan Ave., Detroit, MI 48226. Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by HUD. No objection received after July 14, 1994 will be considered by HUD.
