

Oakland Schools chief quits after long tenure

Amid a year of turmoil in pub-lic education and uncertainty about things to come, longtime Oakland Schools Superintendent William C. Keans has announced

William C. Keane has amounced his resignation.

Since 1890 Keane, 61, has directed the actions of the Oakland County Intermediate School District, which provides services to Oakland County in the Co

Among the changes Keane pre-dicts is a smaller state subsidy. "We're going to have fewer re-sources certainly from the state,"

At it's next meeting on Tues-day, June 14, the Intermediate School District's five-member board will likely discuss Keane's

replacement.

Last year a similar job opening occurred in Wayne County's Regional Education Service Agency when director William Simmons retired. The RESA board eventually hired Mike Flanagan, who had been superintendent of Farmington Schools.

John Schultz, superintendent of Rochester Schools, said inter-mediate school district superin-tendents ought to have back-grounds that include being super-intendent of a local school

"We need to have the under-standing that the person in the job has been in your job," Schultz said.

Keane's departure in August will leave "a big void," Schultz said. "He provided the leadership we needed to be effective."

Schultz remembers Keane's tu-telage when he first became Ro-chester Schools superintendent 11 years ago. "He was very profes-sional, candid and helpful."

Keane's new job will be teaching full-time at Oakland University, where he already teaches part-time. Keane will teach leadership and school personnel management and coordinate the specialist program beyond the master's degree in the Department of Education Leadership.

The Huntington Woods resident began his education career as an English teacher in junior bigh, high school and community college. Before coming to Oakland Schools, he was superintendent in Berkley Public Schools for nine years.

Keane has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Oakland County, the Oakland County Library, Community Services for the Hearing Impaired and the Oakland County Chamber of Commerce.

He has also received awards, served on five state committees and written numerous articles in education publications.

His college teaching experience goes back to 1972 and includes atints at Wayne State University and Eastern Michigan University.
