saw this cloud of dust in the rear-view mirror," said Hildegrande Grysh. "I drove into my subdivision, but thought that maybe someone was having a heart attack or a medical problem."

Grysh, who is a nurse, drove back to the scene on Power and saw the two men struggling next to the car.

"I thought maybe it was family trouble, with one man older and one younger, but when I saw him

(Loe) reach for something in his waist band, I thought, 'There's a problem.'"

Grysh called police.

Just before Grysh reported the

Incident, Power Road resident Petro Poplewicz, who was hanging bedspreads on the line to dry by his back porch, heard the sound of what he thought was a crash. When he came around to the front, he saw the two men struggling.

"The older one asked, 'Please call the police,' he said.

Poplewicz's call was the first received by police.

Although the department's investigation is incomplete, the prisoner had given up by the time backup units had arrived, Godwin said. Loe had shot the man in the leg. Police said although the man tried to escape into a wooded area, he didn't get far, giving up shortly after being shot.

"It was definitely an escape attempt," Godwin said. "He had said during the struggle that he didn't want to serve time and that he was going to get the gun."

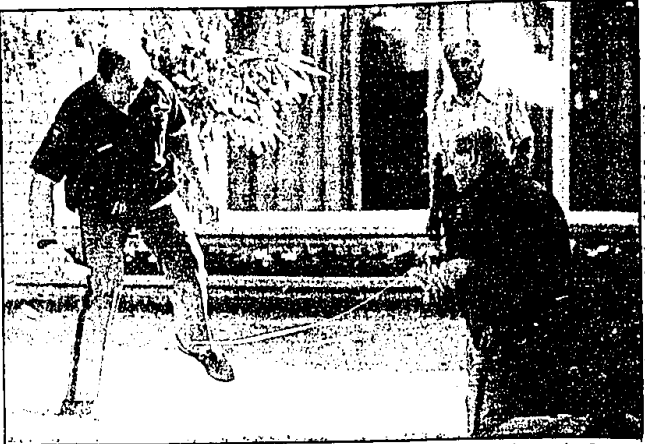
Both men were taken to Botsford General Hospital in Farmington Hills. Loe was released Thursday with no serious injuries. The prisoner was released Friday afternoon and taken to the county jail.

Although the prisoner was in the front seat, the investigation has not determined whether handcuffs were used. The prisoner is also facing other charges in other cities, Godwin said.

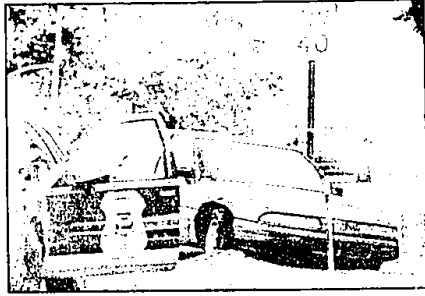
"We had had contact with him on other occasions," Godwin said. "He had always behaved like a gentleman. He was laid back and friendly. You just never know."

Police Lt. Richard Murphy said the department always conducts an internal investigation when an officer fires a gun. Loe had fired only one round in his 11-round clip.

"No officer wants to use his gun," Murphy said.

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Campbell at 8:00 p.m. on Monday, June 6, 1994, at Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. Notice of the meeting was posted in compliance with Public Act 287-1976.

Public Hearings were held on Truth in Taxation and FY 1994-95 Budget. Betty Norwood, of Farmington Families in Action, introduced the winner and runner-up in the anti-drug and alcohol poster contest.
