

# Youth rewarded for wildlife painting

Courtney Shepherd is only in the sixth grade, but her wildlife artwork is already gaining her some notoriety.

Shepherd, a sixth-grader at St. Regis Catholic School in Birmingham, recently earned second-place honors in the sixth-grade division of the 10th annual Tracks Magazine Wildlife Art Awards.

Upwards of 3,000 students in grades four, five and six, took part in the annual wildlife art competition sponsored by the Michigan United Conservation Clubs.

Shepherd won a \$100 savings bond for her artwork — a painting of a moose. The artwork of the top three finishers in each grade will be reproduced in the July issue of

Michigan Out of Doors®, MUCC's flagship publication.

Victor Drenfield, a fourth grader at Steppingstone School in Farmington Hills, earned honorable mention recognition.

## Name the chicks

If you are one of those people who has a knack for coming up with a creative, clever name the Michigan Department of Natural Resources needs your help.

Three peregrine falcon chicks — two males and one female — were born around Mother's Day in a nest high atop the Book Building in Detroit. The significance of the chicks is that they are the first known hatchlings in 1994 out of six peregrine nesting sights in Michigan.

"The activities of these birds have generated a tremendous public awareness of wildlife in an urban area," said Ray Rusten,

supervisor of the DNR's Natural Heritage Program. "We want to give this naming opportunity to the public as a way of thanking them for their interest."

The names will be selected by a committee of people appointed by the DNR and will be announced in July.

## Entry deadline approaching

Entrants should include their name, address and telephone number along with the names for the birds. Entry deadline is July 1.

Chemical pesticides, primarily DDT, have been linked to the decline of the peregrine. Michigan initiated a peregrine falcon resto-

ration program in 1986 with hopes of reestablishing 10 breeding pairs of peregrines in Michigan by the year 2000.

The program is funded through the DNR's Natural Heritage Program, with contributions made primarily through the Nongame Wildlife Fund checkoff on Michigan state income tax returns.

## CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-10-94, an Ordinance to amend Article III, Christmas Tree Sales, of Chapter 22, Sales, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Farmington Hills, Michigan. To Provide Regulations for the Sale of Halloween Pumpkins and Allow the Sale of Incidental Holiday Items.

SECTION 1.  
Article III, Christmas Tree Sales of Chapter 22, Sales, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Farmington Hills is hereby amended as follows:

ARTICLE III. CHRISTMAS TREE AND HALLOWEEN PUMPKIN SALES

DIVISION I. GENERALLY

Sec. 22-76. 22-80. Repealed.

DIVISION 2. LICENSE

Sec. 22-81. Required Fee

It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the business of selling Christmas trees or Halloween pumpkins in any open lot in the City without first obtaining a license for the City Clerk and paying a license fee in the amount prescribed in Section 8-23.

Sec. 22-82. Application.

All applications for a license under this division shall be accompanied by a fifty-dollar (\$50.00) cash deposit plus evidence of a state sales tax license granted or applied for, plus evidence of lease or ownership of the licensed premises, and permission for the City to enter upon the premises and clean them, if necessary, under the provision of this division.

Sec. 22-83. Conditions for license.

(a) The business of Christmas tree or Halloween pumpkin sales may be carried on only upon a lot or parcel of property having frontage upon a major thoroughfare.

(b) The licensee must:

(1) Be the owner of the property or obtain written permission of the owner to use the property for Christmas tree or Halloween pumpkin sales.

(2) Provide space for off-street parking of not less than five (5) automobiles at any one time.

(c) If electrical lights are used, a minimum electrical permit fee shall be obtained, and the lighting system must be approved by the City electrical inspector.

(d) The sale of Christmas trees or Halloween pumpkins may also include the temporary, incidental sale of related material (non-man-made) holiday decorations, such as but not limited to wreaths, roping, corn stalks, and gourds, as well as non-alcoholic refreshments subject to all public health laws.

(e) Each licensee under this division shall clean up the licensed premises and remove unsold items and debris on or before the seventh (7th) day following Halloween or Christmas. It shall be unlawful for a licensee to abandon licensed premises without first seeking cleaning and removal. If any licensee fails to do such cleaning and removing, the Director of Planning and Community Development or persons designated by the Director shall enter upon the premises, make cleaning and removing, and charge the cost thereof to the deposit. The remainder of the deposit, if any, shall be refunded. Any licensee who performs his or her obligations as required by this section shall be refunded the deposit on the fifteenth (15th) day following Halloween or Christmas.

Sec. 22-84. Exemptions.

Local charitable, benevolent or educational nonprofit organizations shall not be required to pay the license fee established for Christmas tree or Halloween pumpkin sales nor required to post cash deposits established by this division.
