A surveillance unit watched as a man made the call with the vic-tim nearby. Detroit police took both into custody. In a statement to police, the victim told police ha spent the night at the motel amoking crack cocaine with three men.

The man who reportedly made the calls wanted to be paid for the drugs the victim used. The victim said the men took his wallet and

keys to his van.

It ian't known if charges will be filed, police said.

"It's unclear as to who was doing the extorting," said Michael Wiggins, deputy director of the Farmington Public Safety Department. "In other words, what's the son's role? It appears to be nothing more than to secure money from his parents to pay his drug debts."
