ASSAULT

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 50, after he allegedly grabbed a fellow Botsford Hospital employee, a 29-year-old Redford man, by the throat and struck him June 13.

A rider on a SMART bus leaned against a driver and tried to grab the steering wheel while the vehicle was traveling on Grand River near Mayfield 8 a.m. June 11. The incident occurred

after the passenger was asked to move back while waiting to be dropped off. The man swore at the driver and told her to open the door.

A 12-year-old child had to be subdued after he reportedly assaulted the family baby sitter at a Smithfield residence in Farmington June 10. Farmington police responded to a 911 call by a 9-year-old girl who said the boy was assaulting the baby sitter. When police arrived, the baby sitter was holding the child down. No injuries were reported. The boy's father said the child is being treated for behavioral problems.

FIRE

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 2 and Hills police used dry chemical extinguishers and water to put out a fire in the brake drum of a 1984 GMC at a lot of Tanis Trucking on 12 Mile at 9:06 a.m. June 8. The fire, which caused \$500 in damage, was confined to the brake drum. Firefighters from Station 3 put out a Dumpster fire that caused

\$25 in damage at Botsford Health Care on Polson at 6:40 p.m. June 10.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 3 assisted Livonia firefighters with a car fire on west-bound Eight Mile at Grand River in Farmington Hills at 5:38 a.m. June 10. The owner of the 1983 Ford had smelled fuel and stopped his car at the light when the engine compartment ignited causing \$1,600 in damage to the car and \$50 in damage to contents.

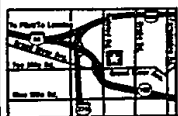
