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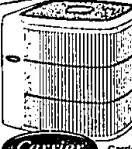
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FATIGUE

Sympathetic listeners can understand, but they can give you no insidious advice. Fatigue means you must rest. No exercise, vitamins, medications, or mental force substitutes when your body states that you must have rest.



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
