## Novi teen killed in Hills crash; Australian man held

Farmington Hills police are holding an Australian businessman in connection with the traffic death of a Novi teen.  
Hills police said a 44-year-old resident of Altona, Australia, was driving south on Haggerty Road about a half-mile south of Nine Mile when the 1994 Chevy Lumina he was driving crossed the center lane striking a 1988 Chevy Beretta driven by Aaron Buff, 17,

of Novi at 11:25 p.m. Monday.  
Buff, who was not wearing a seat belt, was pronounced dead. Buff's passenger, a 16-year-old Novi boy, was wearing a seat belt and was treated and released at the scene.  
The Australian man, who was also wearing a seat belt, was taken to St. Mary Hospital in Livonia where he was treated and released into police custody.

Hills police traffic supervisor Sgt. Ray Cranston said alcohol was not a factor in the accident. Neither driver seemed to be speeding, he added.  
The Australian, who was scheduled to fly back to Australia Tuesday, was being held in the Farmington Hills city jail. Police were seeking a warrant for negligent homicide, a 1-year high misdemeanor.

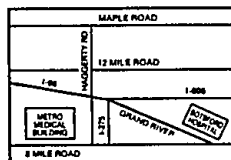
