POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FUEL SPILL
Farmington Hills firefighters had to close southbound Farmington Road from Hearshatone to 12 Mile for almost two hours (4:12 p.m. to 5:58 p.m.) June 22 because of a diesel fuel spill. The spill ran from Hearshatone and Farmington through the intersection at 12 Mile and Farmington Road and east to the AAA parking lot. Firefighters picked up the contaminated material and watered the roadway. The construction company working in the area was advised to remove the contaminated soil to a hazardous waste facility.

VANDALISM
A door wall window of a house on Orchard Creek in Farmington Hills was broken June 22 causing \$200 in damage.
A woman driving a blue 1990 Ford Aerostar on M-5 at Orchard Lake said two men dropped a large rock on the van from the overpass, breaking the windshield (\$300) June 22. The men were described as white, in their teens wearing dark pants and white T-shirts and one was wearing a baseball cap.
Gang graffiti spray painted on the Fall Safe Alarm Co. on Shiawassee in Farmington Hills June 20-21 caused \$200 in damage.

A fire alarm box was pulled from the ceiling (\$200) at the Clarion Hotel on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills June 23.

BREAK-INS
A front window of Parade of

Shoes on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills was broken June 21-22 causing \$2,000 in damage and a woman's high heel shoe (\$10) was stolen.

A front window at Clotheshime on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills was broken (\$2,000) during an attempted break-in June 21-22.

The front passenger window was smashed (\$500) and stereo equipment (\$1,500) was stolen from a 1988 gold Honda Accord parked at the Timber Ridge Apartments on Timber Ridge in Farmington Hills June 24.

THEFT
A cellular phone (\$250), golf clubs (\$600), Harlick competition roller skates (\$700) and a Goldstar VCR (\$350) were stolen from a van parked on Lancaster in Farmington Hills June 22-23.

BOMB THREAT
A man phoned in a bomb threat at the United Artists Theater on Grand River in Farmington Hills at 3 p.m. June 21. The theater was evacuated but no bomb was found.

ROBBERY
Two men wrestled away a purse from a Farmington Hills woman, 39, at the 7-Eleven store on 10 Mile in Farmington Hills at 3:20 a.m. June 21. The purse contained \$200 in money orders and \$80 in cash.

DRUNKEN DRIVING
Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 33, after the man quickly turned his brown 1989 Pontiac Bonneville into the parking lot of Jean's Hardware on Rollcrest, striking a curb and blowing out a tire June 23. The man had a blood alcohol level of .15 percent. A .1 percent level is considered too drunk to drive.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 33, on June 24 after he swerved his car, almost hitting a police car while driving west on 10 Mile from Grand River. The man turned his 1985 Renault Alliance into the parking lot of the Hunan Palace on Research. He had a blood alcohol level of .14 percent.
