## **Big Four networks gear up** for 1994-95 ratings battle

BY JOHN CROOK Watch for ABC to pull into first place next season, based on the fall TV lineup recently unveiled by all

four networks. ABC's victory seems likely as the network plays it relatively safe, adding a spartan six new primetime

"Datcline NBC 2" precedes the reprieved "Homicide" on Fridaya, while "Young at Heart" with Gene Wilder and "Sweet Justice" with Meliasa Gilbert and Cicely Tyson are new on Saturday.
