and then cross to the east side and run south to 10 Mile.

Have it run south from the park entrance on the west side to the ravine, then cross and run south to 10 Mile.

Route the path on to Raphael Street, following Raphael through the Glen Orchard subdivision to 10 Mile.

"The price range is from \$220,000 to \$80,000," said Biasell. "And the Raphael alternative is the cheapest."

Whichever project the city chose would be partly paid for with federal grant money. Zacharias said she would like to see the Raphael plan adopted, not only because it is cheaper, but because it is the least intrusive.

"That's what they've done in Southfield," she said. "They seem to like it."

Bob Craver, a Farmington Road resident who serves on the five-member committee that met with the city twice during the winter and again June 6 to discuss options, said he has his doubts about how well city officials listened and how much influence the 25 or so residents involved

have on choosing the final plan. "I was optimistic at the start," Craver said. "We understood that we were going to get some kind of path."

But whatever optimism he had melted away June 6.

"For the last 15 minutes of that meeting, you could tell they (city officials) were thinking, 'We've had enough dog and pony show,'" Craver said he fears that the city won't choose the Raphael route, but will go with something more costly and not as safe.

A path crossing near the park entrance will be covering four lanes of traffic instead of two and crossing at Glen Orchard Road is not as safe as Raphael because of the "fast 40 (mph)" traffic and limited sight line, he said.

There has been no decision so far on which option the city staff will recommend, Biasell said. If a plan is approved this year, it would not be built until next spring, he said.

Craver said he plans to take his group's case to the city council before the staff makes its recommendation.

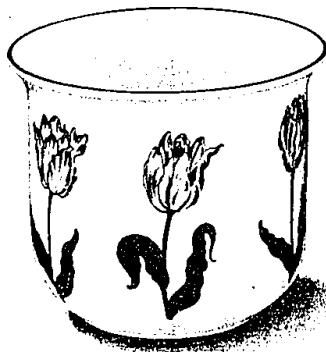
