

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

BUSINESS BREAK-IN

The owner of Forest Manufacturing on Hills Tech in Farmington Hills reported that he and a secretary left the business late last week leaving a back door closed but unlocked, because a steel shipment was expected. When they returned, they noticed a check for an ex-employee was taken from the secretary's desk. The man's personal tools also were missing.

A few days later they began to notice company tools were missing. The owner believes the thefts were by an ex-employee who allegedly has a drinking problem.

CAR VANDALISM

Thieves reportedly broke into a 1991 two-door Chevrolet parked on Timberidge Circle in Farmington Hills late last week and took a stereo. Damage to the dashboard was estimated at \$50.

TELEPHONE THEFT

A Dearborn Heights man reported that he left a cellular telephone on a counter at Kinko's in Farmington Hills. The man said he returned an hour later and the telephone was missing.

GANG SUSPECTED

Farmington Hills firefighters and police officers were investigating a fire in the basement of Independence Green Apartments. Police found burned newspapers, fireworks and a candle. An officer also noted what appeared to be gang graffiti — specifically "GGG" and "KKK" — on the walls.

CAR SHOOTING

Two men in a 1991 green Ford pickup truck told police last weekend that they were driving west on Eisenhower Court in Independence Green Apartment complex in Farmington Hills when they heard a loud pop as the windshield on the driver's side shattered. They told police they didn't know if the noise was from the shattering window or if it was a gun shot. They also noted that a window to a unit they were passing was open about four inches. There was no answer when officers knocked on the unit door.

GANG MENTIONED IN BEATING

Ten girls reportedly beat up a girl who was at her aunt's home in Independence Green Apartments. Two girls were outside the apartment challenging her to fight. They entered the apartment and reportedly beat the girl. The suspects, who announced they were members of the Latin Counts, said they would be back and then fled. Apparently the dispute began when one of the suspects accused the victim of having sex with her boyfriend. The victim, however, said she and the girl's boyfriend are just friends.

CAR PHONES TAKEN

A cellular telephone, valued at \$365, was reported stolen from a 1991 Taurus last weekend from in front of house on River Bend. In a separate case, a \$150 cellular telephone, valued at \$150, was reported stolen in the parking lot of Power Middle School. Another telephone was taken from a 1994 Buick Park Avenue parked on Shadow Glen. The car was reportedly locked when the incident took place.

APARTMENT BREAK-IN

An apartment dweller who lives along 12 Mile told police his apartment was broken into last weekend. A computer, television and blank checks were taken. The apartment dweller said shortly later he got a call from a teller at National Bank of Detroit announcing that a man was trying to cash one of the stolen checks. The man was denied the cash and drive away. Police are investigating.

FRAUDULENT SALE

A 44-year-old Belleville man told

police last weekend that he put a \$200 down payment on a 1992 Ford Escort that was for sale by a Farmington Hills man.

When the man inquired about when he could pick-up the car, the owner said there was a problem with the title. The Belleville man suggested that they go to the Secretary of State office together and the other man refused. At this point, the purchaser believed he was getting the run around. He asked for his money back, and the Farmington Hills man refused.

The Belleville man filed a police report, returned to the Farmington Hills home and informed the seller that a report had been filed. The Farmington Hills man then returned the cash.

CASH STOLEN

A housekeeper at Botsford Inn in Farmington Hills reported that she had \$55 stolen from her purse recently and last weekend she had another \$90 stolen. The purse was reportedly left in the laundry room last weekend when the cash was taken.

BENCH SEAT STOLEN

The bench seat was reported stolen last weekend from a 1994 Aerostar van that parked in a garage on Country Circle.

ALARM SOUNDS

Farmington Hills police responded to an alarm at Marathon gasoline station on Middlebelt last weekend. When officers arrived, they found a window had been smashed with a rock. Nothing of value appeared to be stolen. Police, however, notified the owner of the station.

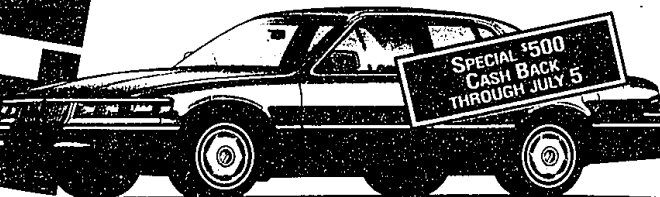

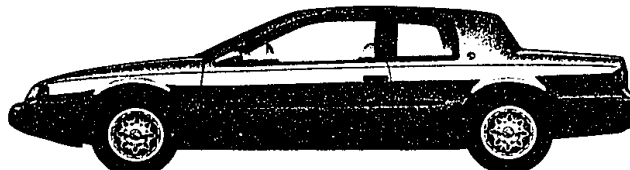
