AMUSEMENT PARK TICKETS

ROAD RACE
The second annual Founders Festival Road Race will be Saturday, July 16, at Shawwassee Park. The race starts at 9 a.m., with check-in beginning 8:15 a.m. The route winds through Farmington, covering four miles. Fee is \$10 per person, \$12 after July 12. Fee includes race T-shirt. Divisions are men's and women's: 17 and younger, 40 and older, and open.
