

Tourney offers chance for novice players

If you're young, energetic and enjoy playing tennis, it's time to register for the Novice Tennis Tournament.

The seventh annual tournament, co-sponsored by the Cranbrook Tennis Club and the Eccentric Newspapers, is scheduled for July 25-26 (the rain date is July 27).

There seems to be a lot of excitement surrounding this year's tournament, according to event director Don Brown.

"I've probably had about 40 calls already this year which I've never had before," said Brown.

The tournament is designed for all novice players 16 years and

under. Novice players are defined as those who have not won a sanctioned SEMTA (Southeastern Michigan Tennis Association tournament) and those who have not earned a high school varsity letter.

The tournament is a great learning experience for players of all ages and talent levels, Brown said. That is one reason why there are many repeat participants from year to year.

"From this novice tournament players can move on and play in other tournaments listed in the SEMTA book every weekend," he said. "I think the attraction is we're doing what we say we're doing. The kids are not being pushed; they're being encouraged."

"A lot of people also like the instruction part at the beginning of each session because it gets the kids and parents together," he said.

Players are asked to meet at the Cranbrook Tennis Courts on July 25. Boys and girls ages 12-under and 10-under are to meet 8:30 a.m. Boys and girls ages 16-under and 14-under are to gather at noon.

Each session begins with a short instruction period from Brown, a registered United States Tennis Association (USTA) professional. Parents are invited to stay and listen to Brown's comments on fundamentals, strategy and sportsmanship.

Tournament action begins immediately after the pro instruction.

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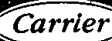
