Smith is sole owner of the Botsford Inn. He reportedly bought it for \$1.5 million on a 10-year land contract. Smith said he wants to have it paid off before then.

Prior to the sale, Anhut had hired Smith as an assistant manager. Anhut, who was born when selling it, still has an office at the Botsford.

The former owner can still be seen walking along the inn's sidewalks.

"It bothered me for a moment at first. Then I put myself in his position," Smith said. "When I put myself in his place, I hope to love something that much after 40 years ... It's OK."

While a historic inn is a twinkle in the romantic's eye, it could make an accountant's raw. Chain hotels dominate, and vacant rooms mean empty pockets. "And if you have empty pockets, you don't survive," said Smith, sounding more like the accountant than the historian.

At least 75 percent of the Botsford Inn's 68 rooms are rented on a monthly basis for \$475. The rest are allotted for bed-and-breakfast guests.

He calls it a Band-Aid approach. It will allow each wing to be redone and named after those who had a role in Botsford's storied past.

"We're in a crawling process," Smith said, "but we're doing it with dignity and with grand plans for the future."

Smith wants to market the inn's mystique, the place where Henry Ford sat reflectively next to the fireplace and where Clara Ford used to play the piano. He mentions the Botsford Inn becoming to this area what the Grand Hotel is to Mackinac Island.

He marvels at the number of people who've had weddings at the Botsford Inn. In fact, he plans to have a wedding wall of fame, including the names and photographs of those who celebrated their nuptials there from 1940-69.

At the same time, Smith is concentrating on those who have never been to the Botsford.

During the Founders Festival, the Botsford Inn is hosting a luncheon July 18 for Miss Farmington contestants to meet the public. It's one of many plans to involve the community.

"I think the Botsford Inn is one of the most well-kept secrets in America today," he said. "In some cases that's good and in some cases that's bad."


