There's an edge that says you can assess your position in life by the friends who visit. State Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farming-ton Hills, believes her accessibility in Lansing is also a defining gauge. "Tm very proud of the fact that diy managers Prank Laubolf (Farmington Hills), public safety Director Gary Goas (Farmington) and police Chief William Dryer (Hills), never hesitate to call and express concerns," said
