# Teachers union plans own lawsuit against state

Second, also unusual is that the labor federation is challenging no-strike provisions — but not directly attacking sections that prohibit unions bargaining over charter schools, health inaurance carrier, starting day of classes, and composition of school declation-making groups. Instead, Sacha said Thurnday, labor's suit argues that the law was or "alongibly crafted" that the entire law is "tainted" and should be struck down.
