# Cities scan new voting machines

Voting in the Farmington area will become a simple scan on Nov.

Farmington and Farmington Hills both plan to have a new optical scanning system in place in time for the general election.

The system is similar to scanned comprehensive tests taken in school. Ballots are marked and fed into a machine, where they are tabulated.

If they're improperly filled out, the reading machine will reject the ballot and a voter can get a new one.

The new apparatus will cut down on lines and ease worties about breakdowns on election night, officials said.

Both city councils OK'd buying new voting equipment at their respective meetings Monday. Through a leasefuvying agreement with Oakland County, the cities will pay for it over a six-year period at a low-interest rate.


