Coach Pete Mantyla has what he considers an extraordinary group of senior players, and his hope is they will make 1994 a special year for Farmington Hills Harrison girls basketball.

The Hawks would like to build upon consecutive winning seasons, and Krista Snow, Kelly and Erin LaCrosse, Jenny Myslinski and Kathy Schneider could take them to the next level.

"The five seniors have been part of the whole turnaround in the athletic program here at Harrison," Mantyla said. "We've had others who were big factors, but this group gave us the numbers to do that."

"They're also the first group of kids to come in when I did. I was starting as a varsity coach when they were coming into high school, and we've grown up together in that regard."

Harrison returns six players in all, including junior post player Erika Greene, from a team that finished 13-8 and was third in the Western Lakes Activities Association regular season.

Snow and the LaCrosse twins are the captains and most experienced players. Snow is a four-year starter and all-division player twice, and the LaCosses have started since they were sophomores.

"The big focus is on them in terms of the commitment they made to the program and becoming better basketball players," Mantyla said. "All three are getting interest from colleges and are capable of playing after high school."

Farmington women earn title of state champions

The adult women's tennis team at Farmington Tennis Club won the 4.0 state championship Sunday and will compete for a regional title this weekend in Indianapolis.

Farmington will represent Michigan at the Western Tennis Association championships against the winners from Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and Wisconsin. The WTA champ goes to the United States Tennis Association national event later this year in Tucson, Ariz.

The local women — representing the Southeast Michigan District, which includes the entire metro Detroit area — won the four-team, round-robin state tournament in Lansing.

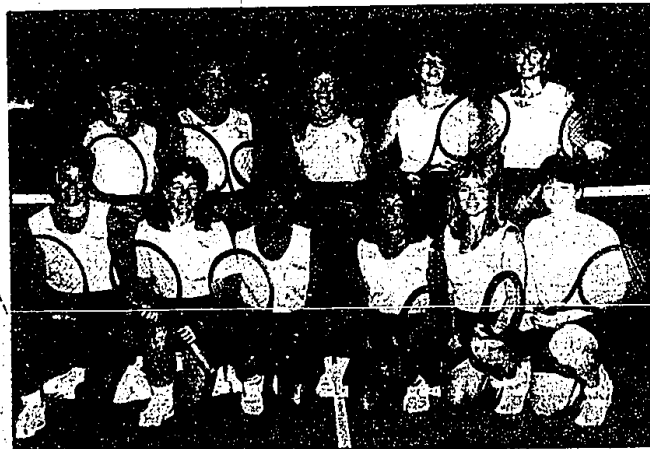
Winning its first area title, Farmington placed first in the Southeast Michigan Tennis Association tournament at the Rochester Hills Tennis and Swim Club Aug. 6-7.

Farmington defeated host Rochester Hills II in the district final, 4-1. In round-robin play, Farmington won Group A with 4-1 wins over Rochester Hills I and Peachtree Tennis Club and a 3-2 win over Dearborn Racquet Club.

Rochester Hills II won Group B over teams from the Birmingham, Wimbledon and Liberty tennis/racquet clubs.

Farmington was undefeated in league play against West Bloomfield Sports Club, Dearborn Racquet Club, Detroit Tennis and Squash Club (Farmington) and Detroit Metropolitan Tennis Club.

Farmington played each team twice on a home-and-away basis and allowed only two points (both by Dearborn Racquet Club) in eight matches, and won all the others 5-0.
