Greene (6-11) is the fifth starter and follows in the footsteps of two all-area poet players — Heather Hopkins (1992) and Carey Perkins (1993), who now play at Lake Superior State and Nilagara, re-

epectively.

"It's been a great opportunity for her the past two seasons to play against two college post players, "Mariyla said. "The time has come for her to establish her own identity as a post player.

"What we need from her is to run the floor hard, defend the big tough girls on the other team, rebound and be a finisher inside. For this year, I want her to be the best she can be. I'd rather have the seniors carrying the load, and I think they will."

Schneider (5-3) was twice the most valuable player on the JV toam, and the Hawks have added three juniors: 5-10 Ami Patel, 5-9 Sarah Rauch and 5-2 Cicely Dowdell.
