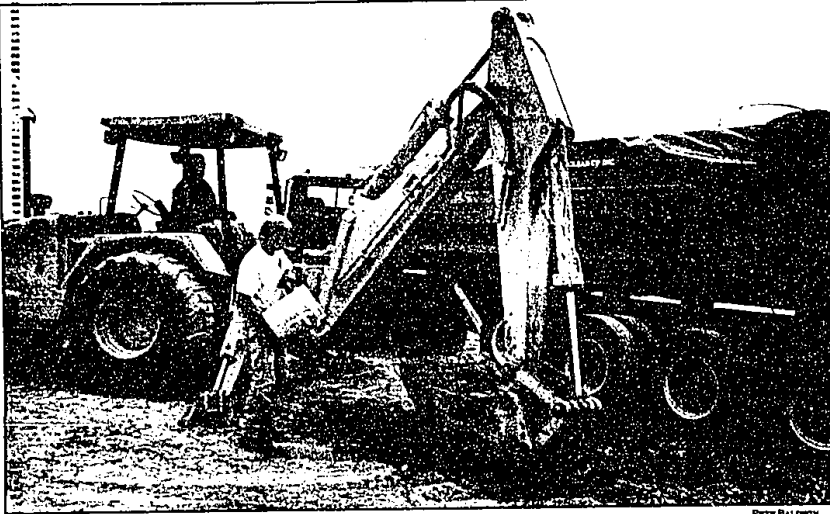


Rare cleanup



**Removing soil:** Employees of Youngs Environmental of Flint successfully removed soil that had been contaminated when explosive chemicals were detonated on July 29 at Founders Sports Park on Eight Mile in Farmington Hills. A Farmington man, Ronald Carl Zajac, had stored chemicals at his estranged wife's Farmington Hills house. Several agencies, including the Farmington Hills Fire Department, were involved in safely removing the chemicals and detonating them in an isolated area of the park. Zajac will not be charged in the incident, but will be liable for the cost of the entire operation.

**DRUNKEN DRIVING**

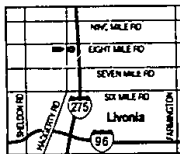
