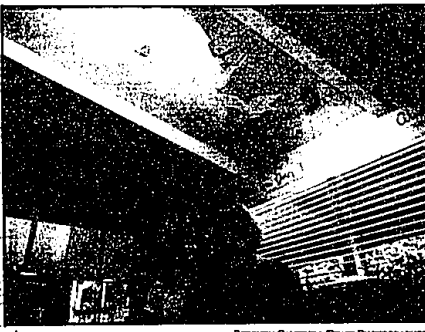

the background, Fay felt like a Renaissance artist, she said. The artist sketched out the angel design on before painting it in oil. It took about eight or nine hours to do the painting, and three or four days for it to dry. The work was done in late May.

"I really love them. I need all the help I could get," Sheridan said, laughing.

"They're fun for me." "It gets a chuckle out of people every time," said Fay, who painted the library ceiling in the Detroit Symphony Orchestra Showhouse in Bloomfield Township last fall.

Sheridan, who has lived in the house for 17 years, advises that the sky's the limit "for such decorating ideas."
