Franchise

The following franchise will be
voted on at the coming village
election:

VILLAGE OF FARMINGTON, COUNTY OF OAKLAND. The village of Farmington ordains:

Section 1. Permission is hereby granted to the Eastern Michigan Edison Company, a New York corporation, its successors and assigns, to construct, maintain and operate in the public streets, highways, alleys and other public places in the village of Farmington, Oakland county, Michigan, all needful and proper poles, mains, wires, pipes, conduits and other apparatus requisite for the transmission and distribution of electricity for public and private use, subject, however, to all conditions and restrictions hereinafter contained.

Sec. 2. The conditions of the foregoing grant are as follows:

(a) The grantees shall do no injury to any street, highway, alley or other public place, or to any shade trees, or in any manner disturb or interfere with any water or gas pipes, or with any public or private sewer now or hereafter laid or constructed by any authorized person or corporation.

(b) The street commissioner may in his discretion grant permission for the trimming of trees when necessary to make the lines safe and accessible, such trimming to be done under his supervision.

(c) The construction work of the said lines shall be under the supervision of the street commissioner, and the grantee shall pay to the village upon presentation of an itemized bill, the cost of such supervision at the legal rate of charge for the same.

(d) The said grantee before entering upon any street, highway, alley or other public place for the purpose of erecting or constructing any poles, mains, wires, pipes, conduits or other apparatus, shall in writing notify the street commissioner of the proposed construction and obtain his approval thereof, and shall, if the commissioner so requires, file with him a sufficient plan and specification showing the nature and extent of the proposed erection or construction. The cost of an inspection shall be held to be part of the cost of supervision.

(e) No street, highway, alley or public place shall be allowed to remain open or encumbered by the construction work of said grantee or a longer period than shall be necessary to execute the said work, and the street commissioner shall determine the question of such necessity, and the grantee shall at all times conform to all ordinances of the village now or hereafter in force relating to the fencing and lighting of obstructions or excavations.

(f) The grantee shall save the village harmless from any judgment that may be recovered against the village by reason of the wrong doing or negligence of the said grantee in the erection and maintenance of said poles, mains, wires and other apparatus or construction.

(g) Said grantee shall make due provision upon forty-eight hours' notice in writing, by raising its wires or otherwise, for the passage of any barn, building or other structure on or over any street, highway or public place occupied by the mains, wires, poles and apparatus of said grantee.

Sec. 3. The rates charged by the grantee herein, its successors and assigns, shall not at any time be greater than the current rates charged by the Edison Illuminating Co., its successors and assigns, in the City of Detroit, Michigan, for similar service.

Sec. 4. This grant shall take effect if said grantee shall within fifteen days from the date of passage of this ordinance, file with the village clerk its written acceptance of the terms of the same, and upon the confirmation of this grant by the affirmative vote of three-fifths of the electors of this village, voting thereon at the next regular election to be held March

15, 1911, as provided for by the statutes and state constitution.

If not so confirmed by the electors voting at said election, this ordinance shall be null and void.

Sec. 5. This franchise and ordinances shall be and remain in force for thirty (30) years from and after the date of its confirmation by the electors of the village of Farmington, Oakland county, Michigan.

Sec. 6. Nothing in this grant shall be construed to alienate the title of the public in and to any street, highway, alley or public place or any portion thereof, neither shall anything herein be construed in any manner, as a surrender by the village of Farmington, of its legislative power with respect to the subject matter hereof, or with respect to any other matter whatsoever, nor as in any manner limiting the right of the said village of Farmington to regulate the use of any street, avenue, highway or public place within its jurisdiction.

ORIGIN OF OUR CALENDAR

Story of the Year and Its Days, as Now Constituted, Told Once More

The Julian year consists of 365 days, and is reckoned by 11 minutes 46 seconds exceeding the solar year of 365 days 6 hours 9 minutes 46 seconds. In consequence of this, the equinox in the course of a few centuries has been considerably retarded. In the time of Julius Caesar, it corresponded to March 15, and by the sixteenth century it had retrograded to March 11. It was at this time that a physician, Vesalius, named Galen, proposed a plan for reforming the calendar. He died about 1536, but he had opportunity to carry it forward, but his brother presented it to Pope Gregory XIII, who assembled a number of learned men to discuss it. It was passed upon favorably and adopted, and thus was given to the world what has since been known as the Gregorian calendar. In 1582 Gregory issued a brief, apostolical, commanding the reformation of the calendar.

The reform of the Gregorian or new calendar, or Julian calendar, consisted in dropping ten days after October 4, 1582, so that the 15th was reckoned immediately after the 4th. Every one hundred years, which, by the old style, was a leap year, was to be a common year, the fourth century, divisible by four, excepted; that is, 1600 was to remain a leap year, but 1700, 1800 and 1900 were to be reckoned as such, while 2000 was to be reckoned as such.

In this calendar the length of the solar year is taken to be 265 days 5 hours 40 minutes and 26 seconds, the difference between which and the true length is immaterial.—The Christian Herald.
