Trees for planting

Farmington Hills received a \$25,000 grant from the state Department of Natural Resources through the Small Business Ad-

ministration Natural Resource Development Program for tree planting projects.

The program, administered by the DNR's Forest Management Division, provides matching grants to communities for tree planting on public lands. All purchased materials and labor must be obtained from small businesses.

"This program has helped communities by increasing the number of trees in urban areas and contributing to local economies," said DNR director Roland Harnes. "It is a good example of how taking care of the environment can help the economy."

Grants totaling \$647,748 were awarded to 42 other Michigan communities for tree planting.


