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CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE C-16-94, and Ordinance to Amend the Code of Ordinances, City of Farmington Hills, Michigan, by adding new sections and amending existing sections of Article XI, Temporary Signage, of Chapter 7, Building Regulations, to regulate temporary community event signs.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.

Article XI, Temporary Signs, of Chapter 7, Building and Building Regulations of the City Code, is hereby amended to amend Section 7.331 (c) and (e) and to add Section 7.331 (d) which Article shall read as follows:

Section 7.330 Definitions.
Section 7.331 Temporary, Freestanding or Wall Sign Requirements.

- Prohibitions.
- Permits required.
- One or two wall signs permitted per business establishment. *For any institutional, quasi-public, charitable or public use, one (1) temporary freestanding sign may be used in lieu of one (1) permitted temporary wall sign, subject to the display period applicable to the wall sign. *To Be Deleted.
- One ground opening sign permitted per business establishment.
- Setback and corner clearance. Temporary freestanding signs for which a permit is required shall have a minimum setback of ten (10) feet from any street right-of-way; provided, however, that such sign shall not be located within the triangular area formed by the intersection of any existing or proposed street right-of-way with the pavement edge of any existing or proposed private drive or roadway in a straight line drawn between points on such right-of-way and on such pavement edge which are located a distance of twenty-five (25) feet from the point of intersection of the right-of-way and the pavement edge.
- Display period - Wall signs.
- Display period - Temporary ground opening signs.
- Projection into right-of-way.
- Area and height - Freestanding signs.
- Area and height - Wall or ground opening signs.
- Removal.
- Damaged or unsafe.
- Moving or flashing signs.
- Community event signs. For any institutional quasi-public, charitable or public use temporary freestanding signs which make known special events may be used subject to the following:
 - Not more than one (1) temporary sign may be located in the front yard without a permit provided such sign may not exceed sixteen (16) square feet in area, nor shall it be greater than six (6) feet above the ground.
 - Noncommercial signs may be erected in front yards without a permit for a period not to exceed fourteen (14) days prior to the event and two (2) days following the event provided such sign shall not exceed 14" x 22" in area and 30" in height.

State hunting season under way

OUTDOOR INSIGHTS

It was a great summer, but the winds of autumn are calling and I, for one, am ready to answer the call. Small game season opens today, statewide, officially kicking off the 1994 hunting season in Michigan. (Sure there was the special early Canada goose season, but that ends today and most hunters still regard the opening of small game season as the official opening day, anyway.)

If you're used to head north before you venture into Michigan's great outdoors you needn't waste any more time. Area hunters are blessed with a variety of hunting opportunities on public lands within an hour or so of home.

Between Bald Mountain State Game Area in Lake Orion to the east, the Waterloo State Recre-

ation Area near Chelsea to the west and the Otisville State Game Area to the north there are a total of 15 state game or state recreation areas that are open to hunting. Following is a brief overview of each area:

■ **Bald Mountain State Recreation Area:** Oakland County, east and west of M-24 in Lake Orion. Thick, hilly terrain spotted with lakes and ponds. Drives a common road squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. Deer hunting is the north end corner. Good goose hunting near the new field west of M-24 on the old Chrysler land, (310) 682-6767.

■ **Pontiac Lake State Recreation Area:** Oakland County, south of M-46 in Waterford. Waterfowl hunting is one of the extreme west of the lake only. Very good rabbit and squirrel and of the state corridor facility on Thompson Road. Fair deer and pheasant hunting. Some woodcock during the fall migration in the bottoms along the Huron River. (310) 686-1026.

■ **Pruned Lake State Recreation Area:** Oakland County, southeast of Milford and south of Wilson Road. Good squirrel and deer hunting, especially at the west end and near the Huron River. Good rabbit hunting in the low lands and along the edge of the lake. Nice shot of Canada geese. (310) 685-2435.

■ **Highland State Recreation Area:**

Oakland County, east of Highland and south of M-16. Very hilly, thick terrain as one of a compass is suggested. Good squirrel and deer hunting. The heart of the area is a field-trail area and lots of pressure during the fall season. Best bets are near the perimeter at the south-west and north-west ends of the area where many rabbits are also found. (310) 686-3433.

■ **Seven Lakes State Park:** Oakland County, west of Holly and north of Grange Hall Road. There are several closed areas and around the day use areas. Call the park for specific closures. Lots of wood land with good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. Fair pheasant hunting. (310) 631-7271.

■ **Holly State Recreation Area:** Oakland County, southeast of Holly and east and west of I-75. Very good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting and good woodcock hunting during the fall migration. The DNR has been conducting a rabbit improvement program in the northern section of the area, east of I-75, offering excellent rabbit hunting in this area. (310) 634-6111.

■ **Ontonagon State Recreation Area:** Along the Oakland and Genesee county line, north of Ontonagon and east of M-15. Heavy cover with lots of pressure and a compass is highly recommended. Very good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. Fair duck and goose hunting and decent pheasant hunting. (310) 627-3323.

■ **Matamoras-Hadley State Recreation Area:** Lapeer County, south of Lapeer, west of M-24. A small area with good squirrel and deer hunting. Limited duck and goose opportunities. (310) 797-4438.

■ **Lapeer State Game Area:** Lapeer County, northeast of Lapeer along Varner Road and southwest of Lapeer along Norway Road. A compass is suggested for use in this large hilly, wooded area. Very good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting with a few grouse. Pheasant are plentiful near the scattered corn fields. (310) 664-8355.

■ **Inland Lake State Recreation Area:** Livingston County, southeast of Brighton, south of I-96 and east of U.S. 23. Large number of hardwoods provide good deer and squirrel hunting. Decent duck and goose hunting along the Inland River flood plain, which runs through the middle of the area. (310) 229-7067.

■ **Brighton State Recreation Area:** Livingston County, southwest of Brighton along Brighton Lake and Chambers Road. This is one of the northern pheasant hunting areas and provides great pheasant hunting opportunities. Lots of hilly, wooded areas offer good squirrel and deer hunting. (310) 229-6400.

■ **Pinehick State Recreation Area:** Along the Livingston and Washtenaw county line, southwest of Pinehick and south of M-24. A lot of heavy, hilly cover as a compass is suggested. Good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. A large number of lakes in the area provide great opportunities for waterfowl hunting. (310) 426-6918.

■ **Waterloo State Recreation Area:** Along the Livingston and Jackson county line, west of Chelsea, north of I-94 and west of M-24. Apple, a compass is recommended when venturing into this rugged, hilly terrain. A few lakes provide duck and goose hunting opportunities. Very good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. Fair for woodcock during the migration. Good turkey hunting in the spring. (310) 475-8207.

■ **Chelsea State Game Area:** Washtenaw County, northeast of Chelsea, north of Dexter-Chelsea Road. A small, limited area with decent squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. Pheasant are plentiful near the DNR district office in Jackson. (310) 794-2014.

■ **Oak Grove State Game Area:** Livingston County, north of Howell and west of U.S. 23. Another small area with pretty good squirrel, rabbit and deer hunting. Not much water so not many ducks and geese. Pheasant are plentiful near the DNR district office in Jackson. (310) 794-2014.

Although the wild game is out there, hunters must do their homework and scout the areas they intend to hunt to locate the areas adding the animals. Use of a map and compass is always recommended when venturing into unfamiliar territory. Always hunt with a partner and let someone at home know where you will be hunting. Be sure of your target and what's behind it and have a safe, successful season.
