Bruegger's bakes 'real' bagels

There are still
places in metro
Detroit where
you cannot find
a good, fresh
bagel.

But the days of such places are
numbered because Bruegger's
Bagel Bakery has come to town.
Rapidly expending from an unlikely base of Burlington, Vt.,
Bruegger's has plans for Canton,
Repidly expending from An Arbor
stores. They've opened in GrossePointe and, most recently, in
Farmington Hills, at the busy 13
Mile and Orthard Lake.
A good bagel already could be
had in that ares; one of Detroit
Bagel Factory's aix stores is in the
neighborhood.

Still, on a visit to Bruegger's
the day after it opened, the place
was bustling — full of bagels and
customers. People rushed in,
gathered their bagels and coffee
and rushed out. Some people sat,
ato and chatted, or read the newssport. Bruegger's typically draws
good morning and lunch crowda,
then things slow down in the aftermoon.

He said Bruegger's product was thick and crunchy, as a good bage! lahould be. Margolick was making his second trip to the store. He agreed with Stewart that Bruegger's were the best in the lares and among the best he'd ever

"These are right up there,"
Margolick said. His favorite bagel
came from a Montreal bakery.

The Farmington Hills shop is a
bagel store and dell that seats 60
in typical fast-food surrounding.

That's something that most New
York Bagel and Detroit Bagel
stores don't do. There you often
huy your bagel and leave.

Bruegger's bakes bagels hourly all day long and emphasizes freshness. Bagels that are not

sold in four hours are removed from shelves. Bordering the coun-ter in the Farmington Hills store is a window offering customers a view of the baking room. Bagels are shaped, boiled in water, as a good bagel needs to be, and bated.

A baker's doren is \$4.29, a single is \$40 cents. There are 10 varieties. Cinnamon reisin is very popular. The Grosse Pointe store sells an unusually large number of sait bagels, said Bruce Phillips, a vice-president of Quality Dining, Inc. the South Bend, Indused franchises for the Detroit area.

Buegger's also emphasizes the remulum quality of its plain and flavored coffees (69 to 99 cents). The menu includes soup of the day (81,69-81.99), premlum soup (82,19-82,9) and about two dezan varieties of bagel sandwiches, from very simple (elgil) at 69 cents) to simple salami, roast boef and amoked turkey, all \$2,99).

The store also offers nine different kinds of cream choese, including plain, boney wainut and amoked salmon, and others that will change weekly or monthly. Most half-pound containters are \$1.89. There were no low-fat varieties opening weekly, but Phillips and the salaming plain, containters are salaming customers they were coming.

Cookies, brownies, annies and

Cookies, brownies, apples and
bagel chips are on the menu, too.
Phillips said his organization,
which also runs Burger king and
Chillis restaurants, are planning
to open 16-20 Detroit-area stores.
A Canton Brugger's is scheduled
to open in Docember and another
in Rochester Hillis in January,
There will soon be two in Ann Arbor.

There will soon be two in Ann An-hor.

The Bruegger's chain, founded
in 1983, plans for 150 stores by
year's end, and 300 by the end of
1995. From the East Coast, the
chain has moved to states like
lowe, Minnesota and Missouri.
Bruegger's is the country's fastest
growing bagel chain.

Phillips said the average
Bruegger's tailles \$335,000 in an-mual sales — 30-40 percent of
which are bagels — close to
Burger King and Wendy's restau-rants.

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
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
