

# Mustangs bump Falcons from district

Farmington's goal was to win a boys district soccer championship, but tournament host Northville had the only goals that counted Wednesday night.

The Mustangs scored twice late in the game to dash Farmington's post-season ambitions, 2-0.

"We really thought we could do it, but the ball just didn't roll our way tonight," Farmington coach Luke Juncal said. "The game could have gone either way."

The Falcons finish 5-7-3. The Mustangs (11-7-3) will play No. 10-ranked Novi (19-2) in the championship game 1 p.m. Saturday at Northville.

Sean Noble broke a 1-1 tie in the 60th minute, converting a penalty kick after Ryan Ramirez was taken down in the box on a breakaway.

Vojtek Rada added the insurance goal with an assist from Noble.

The Falcons scored first when Simon Juncal took a pass from Chris Darnell and put home the shot, but Paul Davidson tied the score in the 30th minute for the Lakers (9-3).

"Our main problem was putting the ball in the net," coach Luke Juncal said. "We had a lot of scoring chances and should have had more goals than we did."

But the defense was solid, and we kept the pressure on the Lakers game.

Ramirez had a team-high 11 goals for the season. Noble and Rada had 10 each, and Simon Juncal had nine.

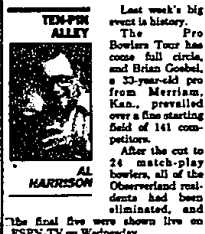
West Bloomfield coach Deepak Shivraman disrupted the call that resulted in the penalty kick.
