OU OKs plan to build new rec/athletic center

Oakland University trustees have approved a plan to build a new recreation/athletic center. Tentative plans are for con-struction to be completed in

Trutative plans are for construction to be completed in spring of 1998, at which time students will begin paying a fee to pay off the building.

To finance construction, trusteen authorized the sale of \$37 million in bonds.

In a survey of 1,051 OU students conducted by Brailisford Associates, about 60 percent indicated they are willing to pay \$455 to \$120 per semester for a recreation center.
