

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

FIRE

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 responded to a car fire at 11:24 p.m. Oct. 21 at the Diamond Forest Apartments on Halsted. When they arrived, the engine of a 1993 Buick Park Avenue was afire. The blaze was put out, but the \$23,000 car was a total loss.

An oven at a house on Peppermill in Farmington Hills caught fire at 5:03 p.m. Oct. 20 while in the self-cleaning mode. Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 4 put out the fire, which caused \$500 in damage.

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 1 put out a fire in a 1982 Chevy Citation at a Union 76 gas station on Nine Mile west of Farmington in Farmington Hills at 7:21 a.m. Oct. 24. The car's owner was driving when he noticed smoke coming from the engine and pulled off the road. The engine and passenger compartment sustained \$500 in damage.

Farmington Hills police were called to a dumpster fire at 7:45 p.m. Oct. 22 at the Independence Green Apartments on Lincoln Court in Farmington Hills. It was the second dumpster fire within a week at the complex.

DRUGS

Farmington Hills police arrested two teens for possession of marijuana at Harrison High School on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills Oct. 21. Acting on an anonymous tip, school officials detained a 15-year-old boy and asked him to empty his pockets. They found a pack of six marijuana cigarettes, and then detained another boy, 16, who had a bag of marijuana.

VANDALISM

The back driver's side window of a brown 1986 Dodge Caravan parked at the Farmington Square Professional Building on 13 Mile in Farmington Hills was broken

out causing \$200 in damage Oct. 21.
