CONGRESS, THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNment, is composed of two houses. The upper house is the Senate. The lower house is the House of Representatives. A majority vote by both hous-

es is necessary to pass a law. Candidates were asked to summarize their background in 25 words and were allotted 75 words to expand on an issue or issues of importance or list priorities if elected.
