The Attorney General is not re-quired to be an attorney. Candidates were asked to summarize their background in 25 words and were allotted 75 words to expand on an issue or issues of importance or list priorities if elected. Candidates were asked to provide "yes" or "no" responses to grid questions pertinent to this office. A "yes" or "no" indicates a candidate's response on the issue in general, and should not be researded as oncoeing or supissue in general, and should not be regarded as opposing or sup-porting a specific proposal. Where there is a blank, the candidate chose not to respond or had a more involved statement.
