are stark in their reality.

There are black and white photos of Gen. Douglas MacArthur wading ashore to the Philippines in October 1944 and from other well-known events such as the Battle of the Bulge in December 1944.

Colorful wall hangings call attention to women in the war and other images from the homefront.

One poster depicts acts of espionage, including Hitler postage stamps Allies used to demoralize Germans through the mail and instructions smuggled by the

French Resistance on gum wrappers detailing how to derail enemy trains.

The exhibit runs along an outer wall and into a conference room. People can view the entire collection, except at those times when the meeting room is occupied, Smith said.

"I'm very interested to see what the community's reaction is to the presentation," Curd said. "We've got a year, Veterans Day to Veterans Day."

The Farmington area commemorative committee has also asked

veterans and their families to write about their own World War II experiences. The outpouring has been tremendous, Curd said.

"People say, 'What are you trying to do to help the veterans?'" Curd said. "We're trying to recognize the veterans."

THE ANEMIA ASSOCIATED WITH ARTHRITIS

When your doctor places you on medication for arthritis, he does more than refill the drug or change the prescription if it fails. He also accepts the duty to safeguard you from side effects of the medicine itself.

With arthritis drugs, the most common hazard is that the medicine will irritate the stomach and initiate a bleeding ulcer. To monitor this possibility the doctor will periodically order a complete blood count.

If the result shows anemia, his response may not be to stop the medication. He may decide to increase your use of the drug under question!

The reason for this surprising result reflects the nature of arthritis itself. For instance, rheumatoid arthritis can inhibit the creation of red blood cells; then the appropriate medical reaction is to give you more medicine to overcome the arthritis.

By analyzing all the information that comes with a complete blood count, your doctor usually can determine if you should stop or increase your medication. However, instances occur when the cause of anemia is not clear. Then you may need to undertake additional studies, possibly a bone marrow examination, to obtain the data needed for a proper decision.

A BACK PAIN STRATEGY

According to a study recently published in the *New England Journal of Medicine*, people who suffer from lower back pain should not rush to have magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) to check for herniated discs. This suggestion is given in light of the fact that surgery to fix the discs might not help. Furthermore, researchers found that even people with no back pain often have herniated discs. In fact, images taken of the spines of 66 people revealed that 64 percent of them had discs that bulged abnormally. The study is quick to point out that such symptoms as progressive loss of muscle strength that hinders walking or loss of bladder control should prompt a review of the surgical option. Otherwise, the study suggests a

four- to six-week regimen of rest, exercise, and physical therapy.
