

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

THEFT

# Improvement plan: City to map out roads to wellville

The city of Farmington will soon begin prioritizing the roads that will be repaired under the first phase of a road improvement program recently passed by voters.

Farmington residents approved a 1.6-mill tax for the road improvement program by 2,310 (54 percent) to 1,967 (46 percent) Nov. 8.

Special assessments are eliminated under the plan, which city officials say will save \$12 million

in the long run. Phase one will take five years, said Bill Richards, assistant to the city manager.

"We have not yet prioritized phase one projects," Richards said.

Before the construction season starts in spring, engineers will make a decision about what projects will be started in 1995. These priorities will be assessed every year for the following four years.

"Those criteria have not been

developed yet," Richards said. "We did not think that it was prudent to develop those criteria before the election."

Some 33 streets are targeted in the first phase. They will not all be tackled the first year, however, city officials said.

The city plans to advertise bid specifications, receive those bids and award them before spring.

"We want to be ready to go at the beginning of construction season," Richards said.

## 19-year-old woman injured in 3-car collision at dusk

A Detroit woman, 19, was reported in stable condition Wednesday at the Ann Arbor Medical Center after sustaining back and other injuries in a three-car crash at dusk Tuesday. Farmington Hills police said the accident took place at 5:05 p.m. Brandon Berry, 20, of Dearborn tried to cross Halsted in Industrial Park from the parking lot of Ingersoll Rand in a 1993 Chevy Lumina when the car struck a southbound black 1994 Pontiac Sunbird driven by Clifford Wilson, 19, of Wixom. The Sunbird was knocked into a 1987 Ford Mustang driven by Andrew Wendland, 22, of Westland,

which was stopped at the stop sign on Industrial waiting to turn onto Halsted.  
Tiera McDuffie of Detroit was a front-seat passenger in the Sunbird, and Shannon Montroy, 17, also of Detroit, was a passenger in the back seat. Berry and Wendland were driving alone at the time.  
Berry's Chevy hit Wilson's Sunbird on the driver's front side, knocking it into Wendland's stationary Mustang.  
Wendland suffered minor injuries. Montroy was taken to Botsford Hospital with minor injuries, treated and released. Wilson was also treated for minor injuries at

Botsford and released. Berry was not injured. All four were wearing seat belts.  
McDuffie, who was not wearing a seat belt, was taken to Botsford and then transported by helicopter to the University of Michigan Hospital for further observation of possible spinal injuries.  
Alcohol was not a factor in the accident.
