The MDNR's ruling also doesn't flow with the Rouge Remedial Action Plan, which calls for the reduction of phosphorous levels.

The Commerce Township wastewater facility would increase phosphorous levels above the long-term goals of the RAP program, city officials said.

The DNR ruled by its decision after a Sept. 22 hearing, stating that even at maximum future discharge flow, the Seeley Drain would be well within its river banks during normal stream flows and would not be critical during a 10-year flood.

A DNR committee of fish biologists will review any possible impact to threatened fish such as the red side dace.

"I find it ironic that even though Farmington has been proactive . . . the MDNR can go against those type of regulations," said councilwoman Jo Anne McShane.

Farmington has 2,000 more students than Chippewa Valley's 9,500 school enrollment. Chippewa Valley spends \$5,100 per pupil; Farmington allocates \$8,500 a student.

From 1984-1987, Cannon was finance director for Clintondale Community Schools.

Her work experience is not limited to schools. From 1975-1984, Cannon was Community Development coordinator for the Department of Planning and Community Development for Clinton Township.

She administered a budget of \$10 million in federal Community Development Block grant monies. She served as assistant department head for development of the Clinton Township Master Land Use plan. She participated on various committees, including South Grafton Revitalization, McKinley Airport feasibility, M-59 citizens advisory and Federal Emergency Management Agency Task Force.

In 1973, Cannon became the first female community planner to be hired by Villacian-Leman and Associates in Southfield.

Cannon worked as a consultant for various cities and townships in matters pertaining to residential, commercial and industrial development, zoning and master land use planning.

She's also past member of the YMCA Macomb Board of Directors and past secretary of the Rivergate Subdivision Advisory Board.

Cannon is married to Bob, a marketing/retailing teacher at Chippewa Valley High school, who is also a township board member. The blended family includes: Brian, 16, Nicholas, 16, Troy, 13 and Claire, 4.

She was introduced by the board at the Nov. 22 school board meeting.

"Board members seemed very warm and committed," Cannon said Wednesday.

She's also impressed with how attuned the district is in following school-related legislation in Lansing.

Cannon will spend her first weeks meeting staff.

Maxfield has already delivered his first assignment to Cannon.

"He wants me to delve right into next year's budget."
