The MDNR's ruling also doesn't flow with the Rouge Remedial Action Plan, which calls for the reduction of phosphorous levels. The Commerce Township wastwater facility would increase phosphorous levels above the long-term goals of the RAP program, city officials said.

The DNR stood by its decision after a Sept. 22 hearing, stating that even at maximum future discharge flow, the Seeley Drain would be well within its river banks during normal stream flows and would not be critical during a 10-year flood.

A DNR committee of fish biologists will review any possible impact to threatened fish such as the red side dace.
