Because in many cases the air bag with are enclosed in such a way that they can be removed without "going off," car part thleves are taking them. Add to

that the cost of replacing air bags that have been set off, by a celliciton, or have been stolen, and it's clear why they are a target. Replacing an air bag can be cosaly, as stuch as \$800 or more.

Motorists should be aware that, like a car stereo or other auto accessories, the air bags are a valuable commodity. "It's a new market," Swanson said.
