

Weiss achieves goal of every bowler

It was just last week at Woodland Lanes in Livonia, where he strung up a 12-bagger for his first 300 game, raising his average to 190. Weiss works at Country Lanes and it is the Country Lanes team that he bowls for in the travel league.

New things always happen to new people, and Weiss is an example of that. As he twice won the Coaches Award in the SVC, an honor based on consistency, and had also been elected president of the Classic 1 SVC Division. This young man can be as quiet as a mouse as he is as loud as a siren as well as off the lanes.

While on the subject of youth bowlers, a new item came up from YABA that a young lady in Williamport Pa. set three all-time records for girls bowling in one year while playing for the team. Katie Remington, a 17-year old, rolled 833 on games of 300-300 and 233. She had 29 straight strikes, also a record.

The 833 broke a record of 825 set only last September in Oklahoma. ON now, YABA bowlers, you have to raise your sights a little to get into the national record books. Katie's back-to-back 300s is also top in the records.

The Turbo Girls All-Star Traveling Classic came to Superior in Canton, and some of our local bowlers came up with many big scores. Tim Saunders of Radford rolled a 279-203-303. Ray Kravitz of Woodland rolled a 244, Rick Eiermann of Garden City, 256.

Eiermann also won the Steve Cruchon 5th Annual Memorial Tournament in duplicate competition with his partner Rick Strobel of the Bowler's Digest. Eiermann's 729 and Strobel's 665, plus 33 pins added on for a 1,437 total and first prize.

As we get ready to close out this year, look for big happenings in bowling during 1995. It will be the 100th anniversary year for the ABC and the U.S. Open in Troy will have the televised finale in Joe Louis Arena. There will be lots of good things going on in '95, more than that later.

take a step forward, according to Farmington Hills Harrison coach Mike Teachman.

The inexperienced Hawks played well again and might have won Friday but nonetheless are 0-2.

"On the surface of things, if you want to please everyone, we had a moral victory," Teachman said. "We're playing as hard as other people, and we're getting banged around because we're skinny. But we want to eliminate the excuses."

"We do have good ballplayers. We're not going to say it's because we're young; they've played enough AAU basketball. We have to concentrate and make ourselves a little better."

Harrison was only down 34-32 at halftime and 43-41 after three periods.

"At the end, they spread the floor, and we had to either back or leave the big guy open in the middle," Teachman said.

The big guy is 6-foot-10 sophomore Shiro Heron, who scored eight of his 22 points in the fourth quarter. Junior Chuck Mondo added 18 points for the Lakers (1-1).

Kevin Bambenek (five assists) and Alfonso Porter had 18 points apiece for Harrison. Doug Brodowski 10 and Matt Dencher 10.

Teachman also cited the play of senior Gil Chavez on defense. He guarded Heron, who had 12 first-half points, in the third quarter and held him to one basket.

West Bloomfield made 14 of 27 free throws, Harrison 11 of 20.

LATHROP 74, NORTH 47: Southfield Lathrop led 25-7 after one quarter Friday and outscored the host Raiders 34-20 in the second half.

Junior forward Tim Dolan scored 10 points and junior guard John Kelley 10 for North Farmington (1-1).

The Chargers got 20 points from Craig Equhart and 16 from Mike Chappell.

The Raiders outscored Lathrop 20-15 in the second quarter to make the difference, according to North coach Brian Weinhardt. The Chargers scored a lot of points on second chances and outscored the Raiders by a wide margin, he said.
