## Hills resident to judge annual high school artists' competition

Entries are to be accompanied by a statement telling the source of the design and if reference materials were used by the artist.

Two-dimensional work should be mounted and matted, if appropriate.

All work should be accompanied by a completed label including the design statement as well as a name, address, school phone number and art teacher's name.

Winning entries will be on display at the Farmington Branch Library in downtown Farmington April 1-29.

Awards will be presented 3-5 p.m. Sunday, April 30, at the Farmington Hills Activities Center, 28600 11 Mile, east of Middlebelt.

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## Common Family Emergencies

Knowing how to recognize a medical emergency and when to seek professional medical attention can be one of the most important things to a family's health, according to Oakland Medical Society officials.

That's why OMS is offering a Health Day '95 class called "Common Emergencies." This 2 p.m. session is for those who only want a brief overview of their role as the caregiver for immediate health needs rather than the more detailed first-aid courses offered during Health Day '95.

It will sort through minor medical problems in contrast to situations requiring professional attention, as well as reviewing what to do, and not do, before seeking help.

This discussion session also will take a look at the home health cabinet, and review a checklist for a traveler's first aid kit.
