"You have all of these farms and other buildings spread out that otherwise would not have been preserved as they were," Moehlman said.

Another admirer, businessman Roy Lindhardt, called Fox "a great lady."

Lindhardt said Fox's leadership was instrumental in the city's development of the Woodland Hills Park.

"She has been one of the community's most steadfast citizens in the fight to give the city a rural atmosphere," said Lindhardt, who has himself been active in parks and recreation issues in the city.

Fox, who is in the process of closing on property in Farmington Hills and the Washington, D.C. area, said she was too busy to reflect on her 30-years plus in

Farmington Hills for the next two weeks.

"It's been 30 years since I've done this," she said about the move.

And although she earned admiration and respect, her political life was often controversial.

"When she was mayor, there were some issues (including Woodland Hills Park) that had the city council pretty divided," said City Clerk Kathy Dorman.

"But Jean and I got along pretty well. I always admired her for her memory and her intelligence."

Former Mayor Ben Marks, who served with Fox on the council, said Fox was a "tiger" when she believed in an issue.

"We probably won't see the likes of Jean Fox again in this city," he said. "I think we're a little better community because of the things she's done."

And if Jean Fox has struggled to preserve the area's rich history, there is historic justice at work in this story.

"She's certainly part of our history," Soronen said.

# King wows 'em at Adat Shalom

Larry King sensed that he looked out of place at the Adat Shalom Synagogue lecture.

Was it because of the sacred surroundings? Or, the lack of an antiquated desktop microphone?

Ah ha, the talk show host and author figured it out. King removed his blue suitcoat to reveal his trademark suspenders.

"To prove it's me," King said.

King spoke at the Farmington Hills synagogue Sunday on behalf of the Allied Jewish Campaign of the Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Detroit.

More than 60 local, national and international agencies receive money from the campaign.

The host of CNN's "Larry King Live" regaled the audience with humorous stories on meeting the mafia, speaking at Rotary functions, and a scam that involved collecting money for a deceased

classmate who wasn't dead.

Afterward, King fielded queries from the crowd on the topics du jour: O.J. Simpson trial, Ross Perot and about others he's met from conducting 30,000 interviews.

"I thought it was entertaining," said Marion Bronstein of Southfield. "I thought (the speech) was neutral and non-confrontational, so it appealed to a wide audience."

Added Farmington Hills resident Michael Shipce: "It was basically the same speech he gave at the Detroit Economic Club two months ago. It was still funny. It was good, but you could say it was familiar."

Some of King's gems:

- On Presidents interviewed: "The brightest was (Jimmy) Carter, the fastest mind was (Richard) Nixon, he had a very sharp mind. (Ronald) Reagan was sincere. . . (Bill) Clinton is very shrewd and very smart. He does some stupid things. (George) Bush was a great guy."
- On conservative talk show radio: "It plays to the worst in us. . . I'm not a fan of it."

- On O.J. Simpson trial: "It's the greatest story ever not to have an effect your lives. . . This story has everything but a plane crash."
