

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

THEFT

Jewelry worth \$1,900 was stolen from a residence on Rockledge in Farmington Hills Feb. 1-22.

A Sony car stereo (\$250) was stolen from a 1984 Olds Delta parked at Farmington High March 23.

A set of golf clubs, shoes and clothing (\$1,500) were stolen from a blue 1987 Lincoln Towncar between Sept. 7, 1994 and March 10, 1995. The car had been impounded after its owner had been arrested on drug charges. It had been stored at Hadley's Towing and then moved to the Hills police parking lot. A judge ordered the car towed to its owner's residence.

Tylenol, Advil and other non-prescription drugs and items (\$420.47) were stolen from the Arbor Drugs on Orchard Lake in Farmington Hills at 2:25 p.m. March 22. A black woman, 5 feet 2 wearing a black and green jacket, and a black man, 6 feet 5, wearing a white jacket with gray or red trim, fled the store with the items.

A \$2,014 Hewlett-Packard laser jet printer was stolen from A.J. Etkin Construction on Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills March 22-23.

Computer software and a disk drive kit (\$900) were stolen from Computware on Northwestern in Farmington Hills March 20-21.

A \$5,000 gold with diamond watch, a \$500 cellular phone, a fur collar coat, a Visa card and \$189 camera were stolen from a residence on Willowbrook in Farmington Hills between Nov. 24, 1994 and March 23, 1995.

Proceeds of \$400 for Feb. 4-6 were never deposited for Arby's on Higgerty in Farmington Hills.

BREAK-INS

A 19-inch Goldstar color TV worth \$200, a \$200 Emerson VCR and speakers worth \$75 were stolen from a residence at the Flamingo Trailer park on Middlebelt in Farmington Hills March 21.

SPOUSE ABUSE

A Farmington Hills woman, 28, told police that her husband, 38,

choked her, threatened her and threw her onto the floor of their Section 31 home March 21. The woman, who is three months pregnant, was also grabbed around her waist and abdomen.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Hills man, 34, at 8:35 p.m. March 22 after he pushed and slapped his wife, 33. An argument had started over a story the woman was reading to their daughter, 3, at the time.

SUICIDE

The body of an unidentified man was discovered by a woman at 3:55 a.m. March 22 near a Dumpster at the Green Hills Apartments on Green Hill in Farmington Hills. Several people in the complex said they had heard noises similar to fireworks between 3:30 and 3:52 a.m. A shotgun was found near the man, who was already dead when police and paramedics arrived. He had been shot in the mouth and was wearing a green winter coat, a blue shirt, blue jeans and boots. None of the residents questioned knew who the man was.

DRUGS

Farmington Hills police arrested a Detroit woman, 27, for possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia at 7 p.m. March 22 on eastbound Grand River near Waldron. Officers saw a blue 1991 Ford Ranger pickup in a turnaround with a loud exhaust and a muffler dangling from the underbody. They found 3.2 grams of marijuana, seeds, two marijuana cigarettes and two pipes, rolling papers and a gold roach clip.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Harper Woods man, 26, for possession of marijuana at 7:23 p.m. March 23. Officers stopped the man for an improper plate on his 1978 Ford pickup at Orchard Lake and 1-696. The man had a bag of marijuana and a metal pipe.

Farmington Hills police arrested a Redford man, 44, and a Hills woman, 42, in the parking lot of the Bahama Motel on Grand River for cocaine possession at 9:20 p.m. March 23. The two appeared when the woman got out and started to walk away. The man came up to police and told them his truck would not start. Police found two crack pipes, a bag with cocaine residue, a pager and \$177 in cash in his possession.

STALKING

A Farmington Hills woman, 28, told Hills police that a Hills man, 24, has been stalking her at her Section 36 home, writing letters, calling and then hanging up. She police she had a restraining order.

VANDALISM

The driver's door window of a red 1991 Pontiac Sunbird parked on Oak Valley in Farmington Hills was smashed causing \$200 in damage March 23.

BREAK-INS

The passenger door lock was punched on a white Pontiac Bonneville parked at the Red Roof Inn on Sincola in Farmington Hills March 23 and an AM/FM stereo cassette worth \$500 was stolen.

The passenger window was smashed and the door dented (\$1,000) on a green 1994 Toyota Corolla parked at Botsford Hospital on Grand River March 23 and a portable AM/FM cassette player (\$300) was stolen.

ASSAULT

A Redford man, 17, told Farmington Hills police that a Hills man tried to run him off the road March 23. The victim said he was driving south on Ontaga in his red 1987 Chevy Cavalier when the man, who he knows, tried to run him off the road. After turning into a lot of the House of Botsford Apartments and then heading west on Grand River, the man again tried to run him off the road.

A 1992 Ford Mustang (\$11,702) was stolen from Valley View Condos in Farmington March 21. A radio (\$347), Kenwood amplifier (\$700) and cassettes.

DRUNKEN DRIVING

Farmington Hills police arrested a Novi man, 22, for drunken driving March 24. The man was driving a white 1990 Mercury Cougar west on M-5 at speeds of up to 130 mph. The man exited in Halsted, lost control, and his car spun around. He had a blood alcohol level of .19 percent. A level of .1 percent is considered too drunk to drive in Michigan.

Farmington police arrested a Farmington man, 43, for drunken driving March 24. Police stopped the 1987 Nissan Maxima for going 60 miles per hour in a 35 mph zone. The driver had a blood alcohol level of .11 percent at the scene.

Hills police seek witnesses to wreck that injured woman

Farmington Hills police are looking for witnesses to an auto accident that has them puzzled. The accident, which took place at about 5 a.m. March 14 at the intersection of Eight Mile and

Farmington roads, resulted in serious injuries to a Livonia woman when the Ford Explorer in which she was a passenger was struck in the rear by a 1987 Ford Mustang. The Explorer flipped over.

Hills police are still investigating, but are hoping a witness will come forward to help.

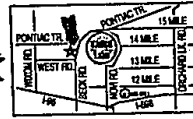
