Hills artist wins DIA prize

Marsha Weigand, an artist from Farmington Hills, has won the 1995 Detroit Institute of Arts' Art & Flowers poster competition.

On Saturday, April 8, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., a poster sale and signing by Weigand will be held at the Changing Seasons/Four Seasons, 149 E. Main St., Northville. The poster is \$20 cash or check (tax-deductible) made out to the DIA Founders Society.

All proceeds go to the Exhibition Fund for the DIA museum. The poster will also be available for sale in all the DIA museum

shops at the museum itself, at Twelve Oaks Mall and The Somerset Collection during April.

The Art & Flowers Festival will run April 28-30 at the museum, 5200 Woodward, Detroit.

The festival will begin Friday evening with previews of the displays, music, hors d'oeuvres and silent auction of the original artwork of the 21 finalists for the poster competition, including local artists Weigand, Marge Chellatrop and Jane McKenna.

Saturday's and Sunday's activities include the floral arrangements on display by selected

masterpieces in the museum, "celebrity" floral arrangements, a fashion show sponsored by Parisian, and a new addition called "Flower Tower" created by area architects.

Popular activities also include the lectures by museum and gardening experts.

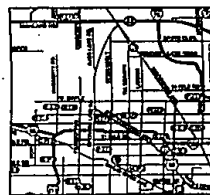
