

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

THEFTS

Computer and fax equipment worth \$10,000 were stolen from Stark and Co. on Northwestern in Farmington Hills in a March 27-28 break-in.

The driver's window of a red 1985 Pontiac Bonneville parked at Mountain Jack's on Sincovic in Farmington Hills and a briefcase with a cellular phone (\$300) were stolen March 28.

The rear window of a red 1985 GMC pickup parked at the Windemere Apartments on Jefferson in Farmington Hills was pried out (\$325) and an AM/FM cassette (\$450), \$325 music system and a nylon carrying bag with items (\$400) were stolen March 29.
