served Southfield on the County Board of Supervisors, he was instrumental in setting up a data processing center in the county treasurer's office.

He said, "It's not being used, but it will be if I am elected." He gave a short address to this statement by pointing out that the present county treasurer is a Democrat.

IN HIS PRESENTATION, Kuhn disagreed with Baker on changing the status of state legislators in running for office while serving their terms.

"I'm against it because, as legislators, they establish jobs. I don't want them to establish jobs for themselves while they're in office."

Kuhn's battle cry was, "We must put principle above politics."

MRS. SCHAEFFER made a short presentation, speaking on Farmington's growth in the 16 years she has lived here and citing that an important function of the township board is to guide this growing community.

IN HIS STATEMENT, Delos Hamlin explained, when asked, how he got his first name and in a more serious vein reported on his 47 years service to Farmington as mayor and county supervisor.
