# Know non-disclosure, time-share rights



QUERIES

Q I have just discovered that the management company for our association has been such at another condominium project and the attorney for our condominium is represent to the management company plans to have our attorney review the contract.

It would appear that both the

It would appear that both the management company and the attorney for your association are in a

conflict of interest and have an obli-gation to disclose their involvement at the other condominium project to

gation to disclose their involvement at the other condominium project to your association. If the management company is being represented by the attorney for your association in another condominium project, that may preclude that attorney's ability to effectively represent the interests of the association, as it relates to any dealings with your management company. It may effectively preclude that attorney has an obligation to disclose to the association any irregularities and/or misdeeds on the part of the management firm, which comes within his ber knowledge. You should advise the board of directors of this information and demand it take immediate steps against the management company and the at

tomey, if necessary, to inquire as to why this information was not dis-closed. The board may consider non-disclosure to be clearly a basis to ter-minate both the attorney and the management company that may not, under those circumstances, have complied with their fiduciary respon-sibilities to the association.

A I believe it was inappropriate and unnecessary for you to sign any closing statement, promissory

mete or other evidence of a consummated transaction until you agreed to go ahead with the transaction, that is, after you were given an opportunity to review the condominium documents within the nine business-day period. Obviously, the developer is attempting to psychologically impose upon you the notion that you have upon you the notion that you have consummated the deal when, in fact, you have the right to back out. No one-should ever sign a promissory note on any transaction until they are committed to that transaction. I hope you are successful in getting your money back and that, in the future, you will consult with counsel before ever entering into a contract without determining the legal ramifications of it.
