The hosts' home is open to 100

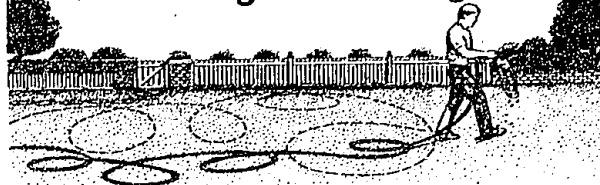

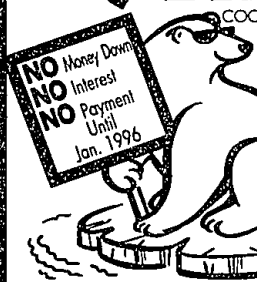
